Charges Filed in Ventura Triple Shooting

VENTURA, California – District Attorney Erik Nasarenko announced today that Glandros June (DOB 04/10/96), a transient, has been charged in a shooting that injured three people. The complaint charges June with one count of attempted murder, three counts of assault with a deadly weapon, and one count of possession of a gun by a prohibited person. June is also charged with special allegations for use of a firearm, inflicting great bodily injury, and committing a crime while out on bail on two separate pending felony cases.

On April 11, 2022, June opened fire at a tattoo parlor in the 2700 block of Sherwin Avenue in Ventura. Three victims suffered gunshot wounds. Thanks to the extensive investigation by the Ventura Police Department, June was identified, located, and arrested in Newbury Park on April 12, 2022.

June appeared for arraignment on April 14, 2022, in the Ventura County Superior Court and pled not guilty to all counts and allegations. June remains in custody without bail. The case is set for bail review on April 18, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in courtroom 13. An early disposition conference is set for April 25, 2022, at 1:30 p.m. in courtroom 12. If convicted of all charges and allegations, June faces a maximum possible sentence of 48 years to life in prison.
